Welcome to Tommy Owens Promotions second show of the new year 'Havoc at the Holte 2' at The Holte Suite, Villa park. TOP Boxing has a fantastic line up of some of the best boxers from around the Midlands with 8 bouts of boxing on the card all sanctioned by the BBBoC, match maker for the show is Jon Pegg.

In the home corner on this cracking show we have two female fights with former professional footballer Kirstie Bavington (27) having the 6th fight of her career. Also on the card you have Cathy McAleer (41) from Belfast Northern Ireland who has an unbeaten record of 3 without defeat.

Twenty three year old Ryan Hatton will be on the show looking to turn his unbeaten record into 8 without defeat. In Heavyweight action you have the unbeaten Dilly Singh who's record stands at 6 without defeat.

You also have former Muay Thai champion Nathan Bendon and Conah Walker both being added to the card.0

The final two fighters competing out of the home corner are Max Mudway (3-0) and making his debut Danny Quartermaine.

Wolverhampton's Kirstie Bavington will be having her sixth fight as a professional boxer at Villa park tonight. 'Bavington's career started with a draw in May 2018 at Villa park against Borislava Goranova. The former professional footballer was disappointed in this result but then claimed her first win two months later in



July beating Elaine Greenan on points at The Venue Dudley. It was obvious to see the progress Bavington had achieved when she took on Katarina Vistica at Walsall town hall in March of 2019. Kirstie dropped Vistica twice in the second round with ref Kevin Messer awarding Bavington TKO victory 1 minute 22 seconds into the 2nd round.

In July of 2019 Bavington was given the chance to fight for the Super Lightweight WBC international female title against unbeaten 5-0 Cherrelle Brown at the York Hall Bethnal Green.

Kirstie put up a brave battling attempted but after the 10 rounds were up and having a point taken off her in the sixth, the judge scored the fight 100-95 to Brown.

Kirstie's was last out in October of 2019 in her home town of Wolverhampton at the Hangar event venue when she got another TKO victory against Monika Antonik being counted in the first and bring stopped in the second. This was a very impressive victory for Bavington and she seemed in a very confident mood when I caught up with her.



When asked about how training had got how she thought the fight would go and what's next for Bavvo she told the column. “

Yeah training has been tough, I've been sparring Terri Harper, Omarah Taylor, Rhiannon Dixon

and Hannah Rankin at fire walkers, I've been working on my footwork a lot getting more technical I've also been down Des fitness for strength and conditioning. As for the fight I will be looking to get the knock out again, I can't see it going the four rounds, I'll just be looking to get her away early really”. Kirstie continued “as for my next fight I haven't talked to my manager yet, hopefully something big now as I have put a lot of time and effort into my training, I'm up at 5 every day getting my 10K runs in, I'm training twice a day, I'm training like made women”.

Kirstie finish by saying “There has been a lot of social media and newspaper reports about me recently about me being a PE teacher, playing football and boxing so I have been in the press a lot, so with all this promotions I have managed to sell more tickets so that a lot better. I have got a lot more interest for this fight so hopefully there something big coming soon”.



Cathy McAleer

Northern Ireland's only professional female boxer Cathy McAleer will have her forth fight tonight on the 'Havoc at the Holte' show tonight. The former karate and kickboxing champion has won her three previous fights in the noble art and has not fought since May last year due to fighters pulling out of contests on two separate occasions.



This will be McAleer's first bout since joining forces with manager Kellie Maloney in November. Cathy has signed with Maloney, who has previously worked with heavyweight world champion Lennox Lewis, in a move to step up her pursuit of a world title. In

a press conference in Belfast, Maloney revealed plans for McAleer to top the bill on an all-female boxing card in Belfast within the next six months. McAleer's debut win in November 2018 was quickly followed by further victories in Belfast against Sonia Klos and Cristina Busuioc. McAleer said "I've been on a rigorous training regime over the winter months, I've set my sights on winning a world boxing title and I've a fantastic team around me to help me do just that"

Age – 23

Ryan Hatton made his pro debut in September of 2017 on the under card of a Billy Joe Saunders world title fight at the Copper Box arena London. He scored a 3rd round TKO victory against Jack Davies with ref Lee Cook stopping the fight 2 minutes sixteen seconds into the third round. Hatton then travelled to Koenig Pilsener arena Germany in April 2018 knocking out Attila Orsos in one minute 53 seconds of the first round. In the same month Hatton travelled to the Odyssey arena Belfast getting another TKO victory stopping Attila Tibor Nagy in the second round.





'Raggy' then won his next three fights on points all over four three minute rounds with his last four rounder being at the Holte suite Villa park on the TOP Boxing show. Hatton's last fight was again at the Holte suite Villa park this time over six three minute rounds beating Elvis Dube

with Shaun Messer scoring it 60-54 to Hatton.

I caught with Ryan and asked him how training had gone? He told the Column "Training has gone very good, I have based myself back at amateur club Tamworth boxing. I'm feeling the fittest I've been in a long time and will put on a performance I'm back down at the weight I belong at"

Dilbug Singh

Age 30

Record - W-6 D-0 L-0

Weight division - Heavyweight

Dilly Singh's made his debut May 2016 at Civic Hall Bedworth beating Ferenc Zsalek on points in a 4 rounder. Singh then went on to beat Dmitrij Kalinovskij in November of 2016 and beating Imantas Davidaitis in March of 2017 both over 4 rounds.

Dilly then dropped down to Cruiserweight to take on Josh Burke for the British cruiserweight Challenge belt at the H-Suite Edgbaston just a month later April 28th 2017. Dilly stopped Burke in the 4th round to win the title. Dilly was back out one more time in 2017 in a 6 rounder beating Jiri Svacina on points.

Dilly then took a break from the squared circle as he got married, the Heavyweight put on two stone in his break. He dropped the weight and made his return at the Mercia Banqueting suite Coventry beating Dmitrij Kalinovskij again over 4 rounds on points.

Dilly will be looking to make a big statement on this showcased he looks for a shot at the Midlands area title.



Max Mudway

Age – 24

Maximus has a perfect record of 3 without defeat, the 24 year old from Gloucester made his debut in December 2018 at the MECA Regent Circus Swindon beating Arvydas Trizno on points. Mudway was back out in April of 2018 again in Swindon beating Jordon Grannum on points over 4 rounds. His last fight was in September of 2019 when he took on the very tricky Kevin McCauley at the Oasis centre Swindon beating him on points again over 4 rounds.

Mudway will be looking to continue his unbeaten record and make it 4 without defeat tonight. He looks like he will be keeping himself busy as he is also scheduled to fight in April back in Swindon.

Mudway's manager Jon Pegg said this about the unbeaten fighter, he said “Max is aggressive fighter with nice skills and likes a fight”.



Nathan Bendon

Age – 27

Former Muay Thai champion Nathan Bendon started his professional boxing career in September of 2018 at the Tommy Owens Promotions show at Villa park when he took on the very tricky Kevin McCauley. Referee Keven Parker scored the fight 39-38 in favour Bendon in a hard fought fight. He then took on another tricky fighter in MJ Hall at Villa Park on February 2019 where he won every round.

Bendon then went on the road and took on unbeaten Conah Walker on the BcB show at Walsall town hall in May 2019 in one of the best fights of last year with ref Kevin Parker scored the fight 58 to 56 in favour of Walker. Bendon stayed on the road for his next fight having his first eight rounder against unbeaten Levi Kinsiona, Bendon took his unbeaten record with a seventh round knockout. Bendon's last fight was in Cheshire when he took on another unbeaten fighter in Florian Marku in a six rounder in December of last year, Bendon lost 60-55 but put up a great fight asking questions of the unbeaten fighter in every round.

If Bendon wins tonight the rumour is that he could be taking on Conah Walker for the Vacant Midlands Area title, this has the potential to be a contender for fight of the year if it happens.



Conah Walker

Age – 24

Conah Walker made his debut in September of 2018 at the Walsall town Hall against Jan Prokes getting a 4th round TKO victory. Walker then went on and won his next two fights on points beating Rudolf Durica and Kevi McCauley. In March 2019 Walker got another stoppage getting a 3rd round KO victory over Arvydas Trizno in his first six round fight. Walker then took on Nathan Bendon at Walsall town Hall in May 2019 in one of the best fights that year winning on points. The only blemish on Conah's record is a draw against unbeaten Ohio-kain Iremiren at the Venue Dudley with ref Kevin Parker scoring it 57-57. Walkers last fight was against Edvinas Puplauskas in Wolverhampton at the Hangar events venue in September of 2019 where he scored a six round points victory with Ref Chris Dean scoring 59-57.



I caught up with Conah and asked him how his training has gone and what's next for the Wolverhampton boxer? Walker told me, "Trainings is going great since the move

back to Wolves, I've been back since October training with Rich Ghent". He continued "We get on well, and he knows his stuff. I'm fighting Danny little, who's a experienced journey man who rarely gets stopped. I'm just going to box and if I see the stoppage I will 100% take it".

When I asked him about the rumours of a potential Welterweight Midlands area title shot against Nathan Bendon he replied "It might be, nothings definite yet, I got to get this fight out the way first".
