





Making his debut as a professional boxer we have Flyweight 22-year-old Brad Coley. Coley is the younger brother of the talented hot prospect Lewis Coley who is unbeaten in four contests. Brad will be looking to emulate his brother with an impressive win in his first four round contest Brad is from Kingstanding and trains at Second City gym under the tutelage of James Thomas. Coley only boxed as a junior in the amateurs and won four Midlands titles a gold

medal in the box cup and was a finalist two time in a row in the nationals. Brad took a break from boxing for a few years but it now back and looking to make an impacted on the pro debut.

I am really looking forward to seeing Brad's debut, if he has half the potential of his brother, he will be an outstanding prospect. I have been informed by Paddy Farrall who has talked him up to me that he is a talent, and I know that the amateurs that come out of second city gym are all good boxers. 





